## **Detectives make arrests of shooting suspects**

Adams County, Colo. (March 31, 2021):

The Adams County Sheriff's Office report the arrest of a Denver man subsequent to a shooting investigation.

On March 27th, 2021 at approximately 5:10 a.m., deputies responded to a residence in the 6200 block of Federal Boulevard for a report of shots fired into a residence. Upon arrival, deputies contacted the victims and determined that no person had been struck by gunfire, but the home was occupied at the time by several persons including children.

A preliminary investigation revealed that at approximately 5:06 a.m., a vehicle stopped abruptly in front of the residence, fired several shots from inside the vehicle, and then sped away.

On March 30th, 2021 members of the REGIONAL ANTI-VIOLENCE ENFORCEMENT TASK FORCE (RAVEN) and members of the ACSO assigned to the task force located the suspect in the area of Montview Boulevard and Dallas Street in Aurora. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and was found to be in possession of a large frame semi-automatic handgun. The defendant was arrested and charged as follows:

Kinson Hilario, 27, of Denver

- Criminal Attempt 1st Degree Murder, a class 2 felony (4 counts)
- Stalking-Repeated Communication, a class 5 felony
- Criminal Mischief, a class 6 felony
- Domestic Violence
- Violation of a Protection Order

The defendant is held in the Adams County Detention Center pending further court proceedings.

The Adams County Sheriff's Office or North Metro Drug Task Force has determined that there is probable cause to make an arrest. The defendant(s) are presumed innocent until convicted in court. The
