PURPOSE:

To ensure that the \$10.00 bond fee is collected and processed for bonds initiated at the Adams County Detention Facility. Bond fees, booking fees and other fees or debts never need to be paid to secure a person's release on a **money** bond. A payor need only pay the amount to secure the bond

PROCEDURE:

1. While never a basis to hold a defendant in jail, the following fees are chargeable as a debt to the defendant after release if the payor chooses not to pay the fee at the time of bonding. A (ten dollar) \$10.00 Bond Fee and a Maximum 3.5% Credit Card Payment Fee. No other bond-related fees may be charged at any time, including any kiosk fees or fees for payment by cash, check or money order.
2. No one posting a bond of any type at the Front Desk will be asked to pay a defendant's debts.
3. Inmates posting their own cash bond, will also be informed of the bond fee, **and asked if they would like to voluntarily relinquish bond money to pay their debts** If they chose to pay the bond fee at that tie it will be deducted from their account
4. The Records staff will be responsible for collecting and processing all bond fees, only one bond fee will be collected per case number, in accordance with CRS 30-1-104. In the event of court ordered 'split' bonds, if the bond to be split involves only one case, only one bond fee will be collected, i.e., 12CR1234 / COC-Menacing \$500.00 CSP / \$500.00 co-signed.
5. If not paid at the time the bond was posted, the fee will be added into the inmates account for future collection and the releasing process will continue.

6. No fee will be collected on an Adams County Watch Commander Release, an Adams County 48 Hour Fines and Cost Release, an Adams County Interrogatory, or on any bond initiated at the Adams County Combined Courts.
